Background



- Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018 replaces the LSCB's with new safeguarding arrangements led by three statutory safeguarding partners, Local Authority, Police and Clinical Commissioning Groups.
- Safeguarding partners must co-ordinate safeguarding services and act as the strategic leadership group to ensure children are safeguarded and their welfare promoted.

- WTG permits work across 2 or more local authorities
- Believe that our safeguarding partners can work effectively & efficiently across Plymouth and Torbay
- Deliver new joined up local arrangements.

- Children are safeguarded and their welfare promotea;




- Acts as non-voting strategic critical friend




Thresholds
